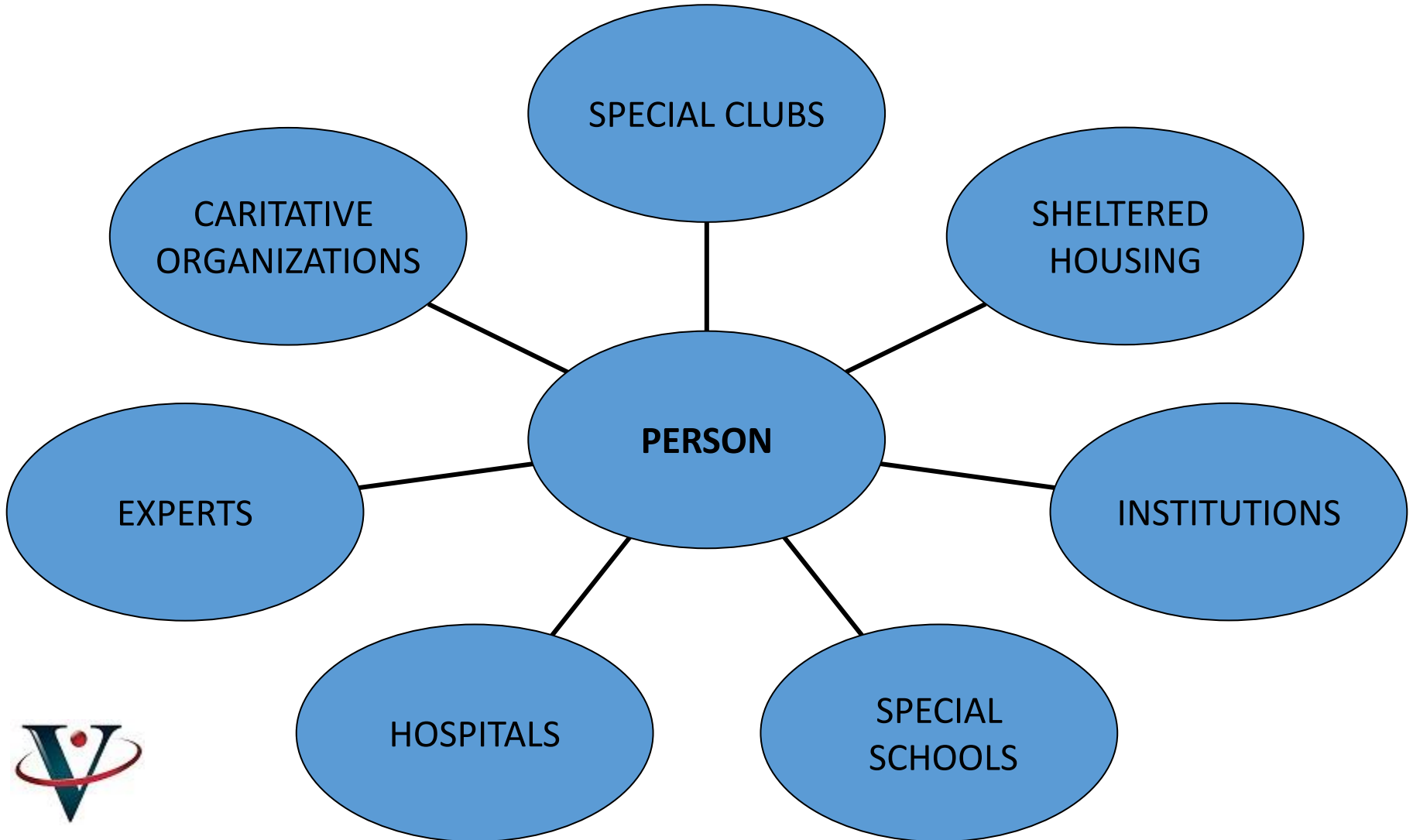

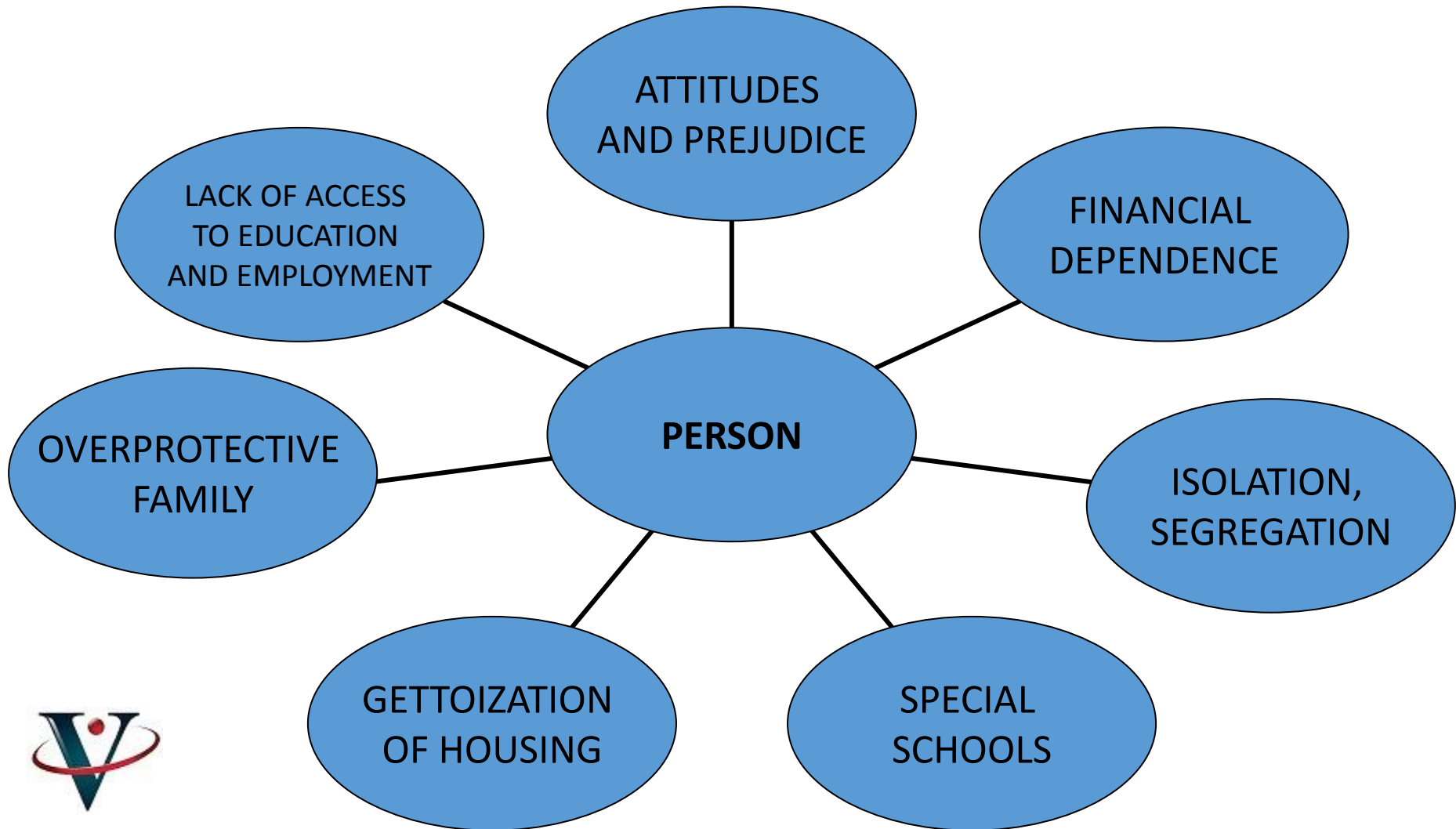

# GOALS OF THE SOCIAL MODEL

1. Integration in society through regional support services and the development of meaningful relationships;
2. Life in a family (biological, adoptive or foster/kinship care);
3. Creating living conditions similar to the regular living conditions of other people and developing an adequate system of support for housing, employment and leisure time.



# NORMALIZATION

- Enabling people with intellectual disabilities to live their lives in the manner and under the conditions which are acceptable for most other people



# THE PRINCIPLE OF NORMALIZATION

- Integration in society – professional support services
- Long term meaningful relationships – life in a family
- Normal living conditions – housing, education, employment and leisure time
- Individualized approach
- Personal autonomy – individual lifestyle



# VALUED SOCIAL ROLES

- People with intellectual disabilities often not seen as valuable
- Influences the position in society





# LEAST RESTRICTIVE ENVIRONMENT

- An environment which will support the individual in a way which will not limit the freedom of the person



# VISION

- A fully inclusive society
- People with intellectual disabilities have the same opportunities as other citizens
- Their contribution is visible and valued as positive
- Their human rights are recognized and respected
- People with disabilities participate in society



# CURRENT SITUATION

- Separate/segregated system of education, rehabilitation and care for people with disabilities
- Lack of community based supports and services
- Lack of alternatives to the institutional placement of people with disabilities
