



GOALS OF THE SOCIAL MODEL

- 1. Integration in society through regional support services and the development of meaningful relationships;
- 2. Life in a family (biological, adoptive or foster/kinship care);
- Creating living conditions similar to the regular living conditions of other people and developing an adequate system of support for housing, employment and leisure time.



NORMALIZATION

 Enabling people with intellectual disabilities to live their lives in the manner and under the conditions which are acceptable for most other people



THE PRINCIPLE OF NORMALIZATION

- Integration in society <u>professional support</u> <u>services</u>
- Long term meaningful relationships <u>life in a</u>
 <u>family</u>
- Normal living conditions <u>housing</u>, <u>education</u>, <u>employment and leisure time</u>
- Individualized approach
- Personal autonomy <u>individual lifestyle</u>



VALUED SOCIAL ROLES

- People with intellectual disabilities often not seen as valuable
- Influences the position in society



LEAST RESTRICTIVE ENVIRONMENT

 An environment which will support the individual in a way which will not limit the freedom of the person



VISION

- A fully inclusive society
- People with intellectual disabilities have the same opportunities as other citizens
- Their contribution is visible and valued as positive
- Their human rights are recognized and respected
- People with disabilities participate in society



CURRENT SITUATION

- Separate/segregated system of education, rehabilitation and care for people with disabilities
- Lack of community based supports and services
- Lack of alternatives to the institutional placement of people with disabilities
