SUPPORTED HOUSING



STRUCTURE OF SUPPORTED HOUSING SERVICE

- Service supports up to 35 people with intellectual disabilities living in appartments/houses in the community
- Staff:
- Service manager
- 2 coordinators
- 16 20 assistants
- 1 accountant



THE GOALS OF SERVICE PROVISION FOR SUPPORTED PEOPLE

- Choosing where and with whom to live
- Feeling "at home" and having privacy
- Choices about daily schedule
- Meaningful work/retirement activities
- Community resources and services used
- Lifelong learning



THE GOALS OF SERVICE PROVISION FOR SUPPORTED PEOPLE

- Close personal relationships with family and friends, romantic partners and acquaintances
- Voice in choosing/changing staff
- Services and supports that are age appropriate.
- Opportunities to advocate for oneself
- Voice in defining support provision
- Leading a self determined life



SUPPORTED HOUSING

- The service of supported housing is provided to people who need support in order to live in the community and lead self determined lives as rightfull members of their communities
- Support is provied to the person in all areas of life (home, work, leisure time, relationships)
- The type, degree and scope of support are indicvidually adjusted for every person supported.
- When necessary, professionals from other services in the community are involved in supporting the person using supported housing services

- Person Centered Planning is the foundation of service provision geared towards acheiving outcomes for people supported
- The person receives support to realise the goals of her/his person centered plann from the service, other services and family and friends (natural network of support)
- Person centered planning is a continous process, in order to acheive the outcomes the person desires there needs to be continuous communication between the person, the coordinator and the support staff.

The ultimate goal of the service is to support people to become as independent as possible and to develop their own skills and natural support networks.
